About the program

The Multi-sensory TypeRight program was designed by Leslie Coull and Howard Eaton in 1997 to teach students to type in a method that utilizes all the learning pathways. The goal of this program is to use all of the senses at the same time to create memory pathway for automatic recall. Students will be taught to touch type the alphabet, capitalization, punctuation, and then to link these skills

into phrases and sentences. Students will learn to touch type using the correct fingers and posture. Accuracy is the primary goal and speed will come with practice.

Jill Neale is a certified Special Education Aide and worked with the North Vancouver School District for many years. After receiving her Orton Gillingham training in 2001, she began her own tutoring company in 2002. My company offers the Orton Gillingham approach, academic support and the TypeRight program. She has served on the Board of Directors for the Canadian Academy of Therapeutic Tutors and have worked as a consultant for other learning assistance programs in Vancouver.
